

BOTTLE CAP FLOWER



Materials:

Bottle caps

Paperboard

Construction
paper

Craft stick

Glue

Scissors

Pencil

Green marker

Black
permanent
marker

Instructions:

- Cut out a piece of paperboard from a snack or cereal box. Arrange and trace on the paperboard six bottle caps around a central bottle cap to make a flower shape. Cut the flower shape.
- Trace the paperboard flower shape on to a piece of construction paper and cut two paper flower shapes out.
- Glue the paper flower shapes on to either side of the paperboard flower shape. Trim the flower shape as needed.
- Trace a bottle-cap sized circle on yellow construction paper and cut it out and glue it on top of a bottle cap to make it the center of the flower.
- Glue six bottle caps of the same size and the same color of the construction paper on to the flower shape.
- Glue in the center of the flower bottle cap.
- Color a craft stick on both sides with a green marker.
- Use a black permanent marker to decorate a red bottle cap as a ladybug. Alternatively, you can cut out shapes from black construction paper and glue them on the red bottle cap.
- To make the ladybug's dots, cut out small circles or even use a hole punch to make them and glue on to the red bottle cap.
- Glue the ladybug in the middle of two bottle cap flower petals.
- Glue the green craft stick to the back of the flower shape.
- Now you have a bottle cap flower inspired by the art of Michelle Stitzlein!
