

BUBBLE PAINTING



Ingredients:

2 tbsp tempera
paint

2 tbsp dish soap

1 tbsp water

Materials:

Measuring
spoons

Plastic containers

Straw

Paper

Scissors

Yarn

Cotton balls

Glue

Pencil

Instructions:

Bubble Prints

- To make bubble paint mix two tablespoons of tempera paint, two tablespoons of dish soap, and one tablespoon of water in a container. If you don't have tempera paint, you can use food coloring. However, the bubble prints will be much lighter.
- Repeat the process for each paint color desired.
- Use a straw to blow paint bubbles to the surface of the container.
- Place a piece of paper on the top of the container pressing down on the bubbles.
- Continue the process of blowing bubbles and pressing the paper down until the paper is completely covered by the bubble prints.
- You can alternate with different bubble paint colors on the same piece of paper if desired.
- Continue making as many bubble prints as you want. The possibilities of what you can create are endless.

Bubble Print Raindrops and Cotton Ball Cloud

- To make bubble print raindrops and a cotton ball cloud, cut raindrop shapes out of the dried bubble prints.
- Glue pieces of yarn in the middle of two bubble prints. Make sure you glue the raindrops so the bubble print is visible on both sides.
- Draw a cloud shape on a piece of paper and cut it out.
- Pull apart cotton balls and glue them to one side of the cloud shape.
- Flip the cloud over. Glue a piece of yarn to the top of the cloud to act as a handle.
- Glue the yarn attached raindrops to the cloud shape.
- Pull apart cotton balls and glue them onto the cloud shape covering the glued yarn.
- Now you've painted with bubbles and created bubble print raindrops!
