

# OCEAN PORTHOLE



## Materials:

Construction  
Paper

White paper

2 different sized  
bowls

Glue stick

Water

Watercolor

Paint brush

Pencil

Salt

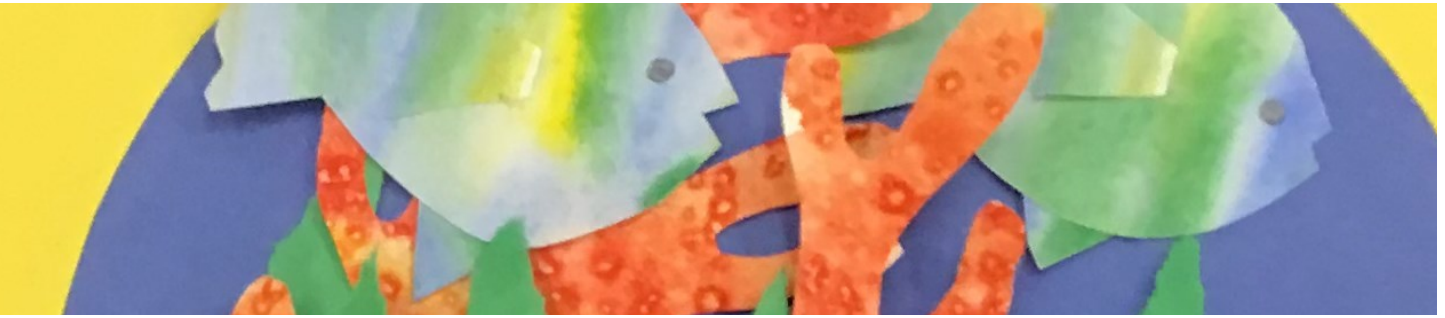
Scissors

## Instructions:

- Start by using watercolors on a white piece of paper to make brown sand, warm colors for coral, and cool colors for fish.
- Add a pinch of salt to the wet painting to add texture.
- Let your watercolor dry, and then cut it into three sections.
- Using a round pan or bowl as a template, trace a circle onto both the blue and yellow construction paper.
- Use a smaller bowl as a template and trace a smaller circle inside the larger circle on the yellow construction paper.
- Cut the larger circle out and then the smaller circle, leaving behind a yellow ring.
- Cut the blue circle out.
- Tear some green construction paper into wavy rectangles to make sea grass.
- Cut the brown sand watercolor into two small mounds.
- Arrange the brown sand and sea grass onto the circle.
- Cut the warm color watercolor section into branching coral.



# OCEAN PORTHOLE



## Optional Materials:

Paper plates

Bottle caps



## Instructions continued:

- Use the cool color watercolor to cut out fish shapes.
- You can add fins to give your fish more detail.
- Glue the parts of your fish together. Add an eye with a pencil.
- Repeat the same process with a couple more fish.
- Now glue the fish, coral, sea grass, and brown sand onto the blue circle.
- Make sure to arrange the items to be seen when the yellow ring is placed on top.
- Now glue the yellow ring on top of the blue circle.
- If needed, trim the edges of the circle.
- Use a bottlecap as a template, and cut out six black circles.
- Glue the black circles to the yellow ring. These are the rivets of your porthole.
- Another option for this craft is to make the ocean porthole out of paper plates and the rivets out of plastic bottle caps.
- Now you have an ocean porthole!
