PAPER CASTLE



Materials:

Construction Paper

Glue stick

Bowl

Ruler

Pencil

Scissors

Tape





Instructions:

- Measure and cut out four pieces of yellow construction paper 4 inches by 6 inches each.
- Measure and cut out four rectangles of orange construction paper 1 inch by 6 inches each.
- Fold the orange rectangles horizontally and cut out squares at even intervals. Save the squares so they can be used later.
- Glue the orange strips to the top of each yellow paper.
- Role each yellow paper into a loose cylinder and secure together with tape.
- On a new piece of yellow construction paper, measure and cut out a square 6 inches by 6 inches.
 Roll it into a loose cylinder and secure with tape.
- Measure and cut out four yellow rectangles each 3 inches by 4.5 inches.
- Make a small vertical fold on both sides of each rectangle.
- Glue four orange squares (from the ones you previously cut out) onto each yellow rectangle.
- Cut a strip of orange construction paper into rounded windows for the towers. Glue them on. There should be two rounded windows per tower.
- Using a bowl or circular pan as a template, trace and cut out an 8 inch circle on orange construction paper.

Instructions continued:

- Cut the orange circle in half, and round one half into a cone. Secure with tape.
- Attach the cone to the top of the large tower with tape.
- Start attaching the four small towers to each yellow rectangle. Glue them together along the vertical folded strip.
- When constructing the square of the building, make sure the windows are facing outward.
- Attach a small strip of paper to the bottom of each tower.
- Use green and blue construction paper to create the land of your castle.
- Secure your castle to the ground by taping down the strip of paper attached to each tower.
- Cut out and glue a rectangle of purple construction paper to create a bridge,
- Now you have a paper castle!
