PAPER SHARK



Materials:

Construction

Paper

Glue stick

Scissors

Ruler

Pencil

Instructions:

- Fold a 6 inch by 6 inch blue square diagonally.
- Fold two opposite corners into the center fold or crease like a kite.
- Fold again into the center crease.
- Unfold it into a triangle.
- Make cuts along the center crease at even intervals stopping when another fold is reached.
- Make sure to leave an open space near one corner without cuts for the head of the shark.
- Unfold the triangle.
- Glue the two uncut triangles on either end on top of each other to make the shark three dimensional.
- Cut out two small black circles for eyes and glue them on.
- Cut out four blue rectangles to make two side fines, a top fine, and a tail. Attach them along the body of the shark.
- Take a small strip of white paper and cut out triangles, leaving behind a narrow row of interconnected triangles or teeth.
- Glue the teeth to the inside of the shark's head.
- Cut out and attach a blue triangle to be the bottom of the shark's mouth.
- Repeat the process for creating the shark's teeth and attach to the bottom of the shark's jaw.
- Cut out and glue a red triangle to fit into the shark's lower jaw.
- Now you have a paper shark ready to swim!
