SLOT SCULPTURE



Materials:

Paperboard

Construction paper

Black permanent marker

Markers

Scissors

Optional Materials:

Snack box

Crayons

Paint

Instructions:

- Find paperboard to make a slot sculpture. A snack or cereal box can also be used. Construction paper is another great option.
- Cut out geometric shapes like squares, rectangles, and circles from the paperboard.
- Trim the edges of the squares and rectangles.
- Add a slot in the middle of each edge of the rectangles and squares. Add four slots at even intervals around the circles.
- The slots are created by using the scissors to make two cuts next to each other cutting out a small slither.
- When using construction paper, only one cut is needed to create a slot.
- The shapes can be connected to each other by the slots.
- Repeat the process creating the shapes until 12 to 15 are created or as many as desired.
- The sculpture can be transformed by adding and removing the individual shapes.
- Use markers to decorate the shapes on both sides. If no markers are available, paint and crayons can be used.
- Now you have a slot sculpture!
